All categories of programming must be encoded, scheduled, and entered into the Tightrope playback system or uploaded to our CG servers, formerly known as Carousel. As each live meeting is being recorded at City Hall, it is routed to the North Metro TV head-end and then sent out live over the cable system. Meetings are scheduled for replay based on schedules requested by each City. Additional, full length video programs, produced by NMTV staff, are also scheduled on the channels. Shorter videos and promos are loaded onto the CG servers, rather than being scheduled as separate playbacks. These short videos play back in a repeating cycle, along with graphics pages, and air on the channels between scheduled programs, 24 hours a day. The table below outlines how many times a regular length video program was entered into the Tightrope system and played back on each City channel.

This is accomplished through a system owned by North Metro TV and does not incur an additional cost. RE: Rice Creek Watershed District Appointment

Dear City Administrator/Manager:

In accordance with the provisions of Minn. Stat. § 103B.227, Anoka County is notifying you there is a manger on the Rice Creek Watershed District Board, Steven Wagamon, with a term of office set to expire on January 17, 2025. Because the Rice Creek Watershed District is considered a watershed management organization, Anoka County is accepting applications and/or nominations for this position on the board. For your information, a copy of the published notice and a map with the current location of the board members is enclosed.

Minn. Stat. § 103D.311 allows cities located within the district to submit three or more nominees for county board consideration. Cities may jointly or severally submit their nominees. The county board must receive city nominees, if any, by at least 60 days before the outgoing manager's term of office expires. For reference, the affected cities within the Rice Creek Watershed District are Blaine, Centerville, Circle Pines, Columbia Heights, Columbus, Fridley, Lexington, Lino Lakes, and Spring Lake Park.

To be eligible for appointment, nominees must reside within the watershed district boundaries, be eligible to vote in the district, and may not be a public officer of the county, state, or federal government, except that a soil and water conservation supervisor may be a manager.

If the county board receives an aggregate list of three or more qualified city nominees, it will appoint one of those nominees unless it finds the nominees cannot fairly represent the various hydrologic areas in the watershed district by residence of the manager appointed. If it finds the nominees cannot fairly represent the hydrologic areas, the county board will appoint an eligible resident from a non-nominating city within the watershed district who can fairly represent the watershed district. In arriving at its decision, the county board will review the applications, nominations, and other information as required, up to or including interviewing the candidates. Note: interviews may not be required for every appointment.

If the county board does not receive an aggregate list of three or more qualified city nominees, the county will appoint an eligible person residing in the watershed district who can fairly represent the various hydrologic areas in the watershed district.

The term of office is set to expire on January 17, 2025. City nominations must therefore be received by Thursday, November 18, 2024.

All applicants must submit a completed application form to the county board, and applicants are encouraged to contact their respective cities of residence for formal nomination. Find the application here.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 103B.227 and § 103D.311 that a vacancy will occur on the Rice Creek Watershed District Board of Managers due to the expiration on January 17, 2025, of the term of Steve Wagamon, City of Columbus. Term of the appointment is for three years. Managers are eligible to be reappointed. Persons interested in being appointed to serve on the Rice Creek Watershed District Board of Managers may submit their names for consideration to the Anoka County Board of Commissioners, the appointing authority. Minn, Stat. § 103D.311 permits cities in the district to jointly or severally submit nominees to the county board for consideration. As city nominees are submitted for consideration, they are added to an aggregate list of nominees. If the cities submit three or more nominees eligible for a manager's position at least 60 days prior to the expiration of the term or by November 18, 2024, the Anoka County Board of Commissioners shall consider and appoint one of the city nominees unless it concludes none of the city nominees can fairly represent the various hydrologic areas in the watershed district. Since a list may be submitted, persons interested in being considered for appointment may wish to contact their city to request to be included on a list of nominations. In the absence of a valid aggregate list of nominees, the Anoka County Board of Commissioners may appoint any voting resident of the Rice Creek Watershed District who is not a public officer of the county, state, or federal government and who otherwise complies with the requirements and terms of Minn. Stat. § 103D.311.



Mayor Grote called to order the Regular City Council meeting for September 19, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. Councilmembers present: Devries, Murphy, and Winge Excused absence: Benson. Also Present: Bill Petracek, City Administrator; Kurt Glaser, City Attorney; Chris Galiov, Finance Director; Steve Winter and Tim Bicknell, MSA Consultants; Jason and Ted Stomel, Northway Mall owners; The Quad Press; Barb Mahr and Jill Hunt.

3. CITIZENS FORUM

Jason Stomel Owner, Northway Mall California

Mr. Stomel was present to address the Council on the potential of a Chipotle Restaurant and other restaurants in Northway Mall. He stated that there have been a significant number of vacancies in Northway Mall over the past years and added that they have had interest from Chipotle to build a new restaurant in the parking lot of Northway Mall. He continued by saying that he is very confident that Chipotle would bring in other restaurants to the vacant lot in front of the daycare. He added that this addition is super critical for the revitalization of Northway Mall. Discussion ensued.

Stomel handed out a brochure with community input that he obtained through Facebook. He stated that there was a high level of desire for new restaurants in Lexington. He understands that there may be too many Mexican restaurants in the Lexington area, but he feels there are differences between a Chipotle, El Lorro, and Pancho's. Discussion ensued.

RESOLUTION NO. 24-16

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING ASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, pursuant to proper notice duly given as required by law, the council has met and heard and passed upon all objections to the proposed assessment for the <u>2024 Street Improvements</u> project on of the following streets:

Griggs Avenue between Flowerfield Road and Restwood Road and Griggs Avenue between Approximately 375 feet North of Restwood Road (to exclude the new bituminous overlay at Lexington Lofts) and Lake Drive);) by milling the surface and placing a bituminous overlay with street patching and repairs to the concrete curb and valley gutters, and storm sewer repairs as needed and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEXINGTON, MINNESOTA:

- 1. Such proposed assessment, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby accepted and shall constitute the special assessment against the lands named therein, and each tract of land therein included is hereby found to be benefited by the proposed improvement in the amount of the assessment levied against it.
- 2. Such assessment shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 10 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January 2025 and shall bear interest at the rate of 5.0 percent per annum from the date of the adoption of this assessment resolution. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from the date of this resolution until December 31, 2025. To each subsequent installment, when due, shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.
- 3. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the whole of the assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the city treasurer, except that no interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid within 30 days from the adoption of this resolution; and he/she may, at any time thereafter, pay to the city treasurer the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the next succeeding year.
- 4. The clerk shall forthwith transmit a certified duplicate of this assessment to the county auditor to be extended on the property tax lists of the county. Such assessments shall be collected and paid over in the same manner as other municipal taxes.

Members who obtain liability coverage from LMCIT must decide whether to waive the statutory tort liability limits to the extent of the coverage purchased. The decision to waive or not waive the statutory tort limits must be made annually by the member's governing body, in consultation with its attorney if necessary. The decision has the following effects:

- If the member does not waive the statutory tort limits, an individual claimant could recover no more than \$500,000 on any claim to which the statutory tort limits apply. The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would be limited to \$1,500,000. These statutory tort limits would apply regardless of whether the member purchases the optional LMCIT excess liability coverage.
- If the member waives the statutory tort limits and does not purchase excess liability coverage, a single claimant could recover up to \$2,000,000 for a single occurrence (under the waive option, the tort cap liability limits are only waived to the extent of the member's liability coverage limits, and the LMCIT per occurrence limit is \$2,000,000). The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would also be limited to \$2,000,000, regardless of the number of claimants.
- If the member waives the statutory tort limits and purchases excess liability coverage, a single claimant could potentially recover an amount up to the limit of the coverage purchased. The total all claimants could recover for a single occurrence to which the statutory tort limits apply would also be limited to the amount of coverage purchased, regardless of the number of claimants.

Claims to which the statutory municipal tort limits do not apply are not affected by this decision.
