Channel Management



Programming Coordinator Michele Silvester, along with help from TJ Tronson and Eric Houston, is responsible for processing and scheduling the programming on the city channels. There are three categories of programs that are scheduled on the city channels: live and replayed meetings, NMTV staff created video content, and informational graphics pages. All categories of programming must be encoded, scheduled, and entered into the Tightrope playback system or uploaded to our CG servers, formerly known as Carousel. As each live meeting is recorded at City Hall, it is routed to the North Metro TV head-end and then sent out live over the cable system. Meetings are scheduled for replay based on schedules requested by each City. Additional, full length video programs, produced by NMTV staff, are also scheduled on the channels. Shorter videos and promos are loaded onto the CG servers, rather than being scheduled as separate playbacks. These short videos play back in a repeating cycle, along with graphics pages, and air on the channels between scheduled programs, 24 hours a day. The table below outlines how many times a regular length video program was entered into the Tightrope system and played back on each City channel.

The last category of programming on City channels consists of a bulletin board, or graphics pages, that display information about the City, local events, and other issues of interest to citizens. With the installation of the CG servers, Eric Houston updates the information on all seven channels. He works closely with City staff to ensure that all requested informational slides are created and posted to the satisfaction of the city. Even though Eric is doing the work of creating the informational pages, the Cities maintain editorial control. In addition to the graphics pages, the CG units play video. Each video's producer is responsible

Closed Captioning



Closed captioning is an additional service provided by North Metro TV. Every city meeting is closed captioned live via our Tightrope system. That process is assigned a per-minute price by Tightrope. Once the meeting is recorded on our servers for repeat airings, that version of the meeting must be captioned separately. This is accomplished through a system owned by North Metro TV and does not incur additional costs. 

SOCIAL MEDIA SUCCESS

October was another banner month for NMTV social media, setting a new high-water mark with 246,426 views across Facebook, YouTube, and X. That represents a 76 percent increase over September's record setting month. Numbers were once again buoyed by sports videos, with 100,400 views, and road construction updates, 126,127 views.

We also saw record numbers of new channel subscribers this month, with 194 new YouTube subscribers and a staggering 551 people subscribing to our Facebook page for the first time. This all means one thing: more people than ever are watching videos about our member cities.




Recycling Conversation

A Spark in Circle Pines

Circle Pines is getting a brand-new electrical substation courtesy of Connexus Energy. The city's current substation was installed in 1968, before many of the nearby houses were even built. Substations reduce electrical voltage to normal distribution levels suitable for home electronics. Erica Schmidt of Connexus Energy says the new substation is designed to handle higher energy demands caused by things like increased data demands and electric cars. The several million dollar project will see the installation of a new transformer, equipment, and better engineering standards. Erica expects the new substation will be up and running this December. The Lexington Center Third Addition Final Plat was submitted to the City of Lexington on September 30, 2025 by the Developer, Menlo Capital Partners LLC. They submitted an updated Final Plat on November 10, 2025, that increased the utility easement for the watermain. The Developer has completed most of the improvements on the project at this time and we will be working with them on closing out the project as needed.

We have reviewed the Final Plat that was submitted and have the following comments listed below.

1. Final Plat

- a. A drainage and utility easements are needed for the watermain and hydrants on the property minimum is 10 feet around all watermain and hydrants. The easement was increase to 15 feet on Block 1 Lot 2. They hydrant at the Chipotle on Block 1 Lot 2 was not installed in the center of the island, and must to be verified in the final construction asbuilts. If any adjustments are required they must be done before the project is closed.
- b. Documentation Easements and Maintenance Obligations The draft operation and maintenance plan for the Stormwater system must be submitted to the City for review and approval. The Storm Sewer system must also have an easement over it to allow the City or RCWD to review it and maintain it if the owner fails to maintain it. A receipt showing recordation of the approved maintenance declaration and the drainage and flowage easements.


We recommend approval of the Final Plat at this time. The Developer and the design Engineer are working on Items above before we close out the Developer's Agreement.
