Parking restrictions are in Effect

***No Parking allowed on City streets between the hours of 2 AM and 6 AM without an emergency parking permit issued by staff at City Hall.

***No Parking on any street after a snowfall with accumulations of 2 inches or more until all snow, ice and similar debris have been removed from the paved portion of the street.

*** It is illegal to remove snow from private property and place it on the road or sidewalk.



Lexington's Public Works Department would like to offer the residents on corner lots or curved streets, free curb markers that you can place directly at the curb to help the plow drivers save some sod on the first few snow falls. Once the snow banks get built up and they are wing plowed further back, the markers will get broken off and will not be needed any more. The markers will be available at city hall. You can also mark utility, cable, phone boxes etc.

With all the holiday cooking going on this time of year please check to make sure your smoke detectors are in working order. Cooking leads to over 70% of fire injuries this time of the year. Remember to change the batteries in your smoke detector 2 times a year and have one in every bedroom, in the hall outside each bedroom and on each level of your home.



The City of Lexington has collection bins located on the west side of the building for your recycling.

Allowed items are: *Clothes, Footwear, Accessories* (Belts, Hats, Gloves, Handbags, Scarfs, Backpacks etc.) , *Linens* (Towels, Bedding, Blankets, Drapes etc.)

To properly dispose of your Christmas tree, garland & wreaths you can bring them to one of the compost sites in the county.

They accept grass, leaves, non-woody yard waste, tree waste and organics. You are required to unload your own yard waste and take empty bags/containers with you. Tree waste may be loose or bundled. Check out their website for times they are open & fees



Garbage Cart Placement

Snowplow crews rely on residents' help to place garbage, recycling and yard waste carts behind the curb when it is trash pick-up day. Carts placed in the street interfere with snowplowing operations. Crews are unable to plow the streets from curb-to-curb when carts are in the street. If trash / recycling pickup day coincides with plowing activities, make sure your trash can and recycling bin are well behind the curb or in the driveway so the plow & the snow pushed up from the plows will not hit them.



Holiday Tree Safety Tips

Ensure a merry and bright holiday season by safely maintaining your tree with the following tips.

Keep away from heat: Make sure your tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like an air duct, fireplace or space heater.



Examine cords: Examine extension cords and lights for signs of damage. Frayed electric cords should be discarded.



Keep it watered: Fill the water reservoir daily and check the condition of the trunk bark and branches for moisture. Shedding or dry needles could mean the tree is drying out, increasing overall fire risks.



Inspect lights: Carefully inspect all electrical decorations before you use them. Cracked or damaged sockets and/or loose or exposed wires can cause serious shock or start a fire.

Trim the stump: Trim the tree's stump by at least two inches on freshly cut trees. Allow it to absorb water for 24 hours before bringing it inside.
