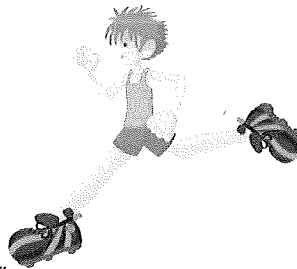

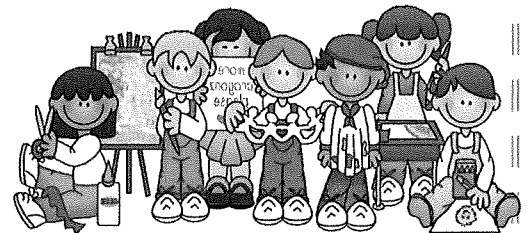
Get involved and Volunteer

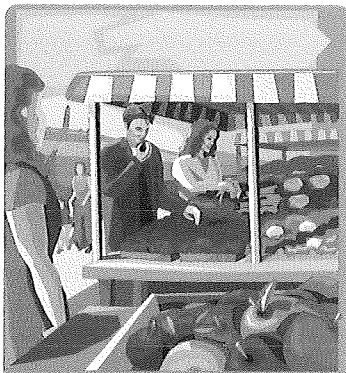

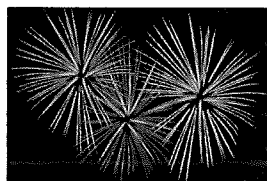
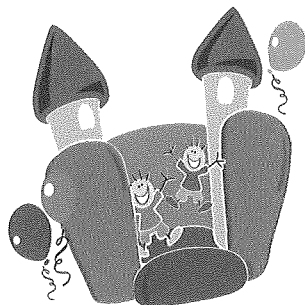
The City of Lexington is hoping to once again partner with Circle Pines and Centerville for a fall recycling and clean up day in September.

The City of Lexington and Rice Creek Watershed District want you to remember..

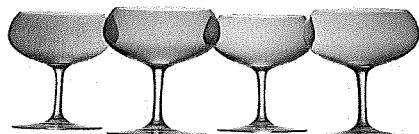

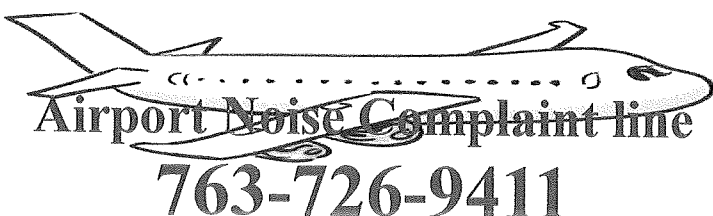

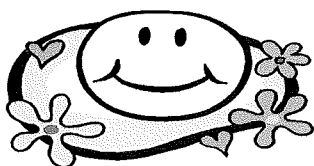
THE SNACKS OF SUMMER

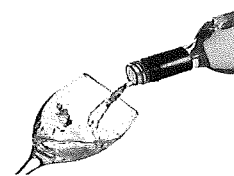
Stick with fruit for a great healthy snack, and put the scraps in your composting bin or in organics recycling.

Anoka/Washington County Head Start/Early Head Start

High quality early learning programs serving income-eligible children birth to five years old and pregnant women who are residents of Anoka and Washington Counties.

Early Head Start Child Care Partnership

Through partnerships with local child care centers and family child care providers, children 6 weeks to 36 months receive full day full year services.

Early Head Start Home Visiting

Pregnant moms receive weekly home visits emphasizing a healthy bond between parents and children. Children-Birth to three receive weekly home visits by a high quality teacher and can attend classroom socialization days twice per month.

Part Day-Part Year Preschool

Preschool classes offered to children three to five old Monday-Thursday for 3.5 hours per day.

Full Day-Full Year Preschool

Preschool classes offered to children three to five old Monday- Thursday for 6 hours per day, whose parents or guardians are working or in school

Home Base Preschool Program

Children will receive weekly home visits by a high quality teacher and can attend socialization days twice per month

Transportation available

Diapers Assistance

Free nutritional meals and snacks

Educational classroom experience by highly qualified staff

Family service workers to assist with family goal setting and referring to community resources

Health and development screening

Parenting support and workshops

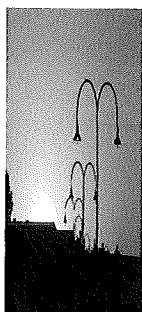

* **TIER II** - Odd/Even days and NO Watering between the hours of 10:00 am and 7:00 pm

In addition to the above **TIER I ODD/ EVEN** days restriction , watering is prohibited by all properties between the hours of 10:00 am-7:00 pm
